Induction into the Cooperative Hall of Fame is the highest honor that the cooperative community bestows on those men and women whose endeavors in the cause of the cooperative form of enterprise have been GENUINELY HEROIC. The Cooperative Hall of Fame provides recognition for persons contributing in especially significant ways to the enhancement of the cooperative idea and its broader acceptance in the United States, or to the substantial advancement of cooperative enterprise in any of its various forms. The Cooperative Hall of Fame Screening and Selection Committees use the following criteria in reviewing all nominations:

- 1. Demonstrated statesmanship, innovation, personal commitment, leadership, and vision beyond the professional competence and requirements of the position for which he/she was employed to serve within the cooperative sector.
- 2. Achievement of identifiable and lasting changes to improve and promote cooperatives.
- Inspired and persuaded others to act to advance the cooperative system.
- 4. Recognized nationally for work in or relating to cooperatives.

VI. DURATION OF A NOMINATION

Once an individual has been nominated, his/her nomination stays in the active pool of nominees for three years. Sponsors are encouraged to submit updated information on the nominee at any time during that three year period, but there is no requirement for that to be done. If the individual is not selected for induction during that three year period, the individual becomes ineligible for renomination for one year. After that year, an individual can be nominated again with a completely new nomination package.

Inductees selected for inclusion in the Cooperative Hall of Fame in 2006 will be recognized at a banquet in their honor, the Cooperative Hall of Fame induction ceremony, which will be held in Washington D.C. in the Spring of 2007.
